WHEREAS this court has found probable cause to believe that the defendant, KELSEY MARIE LEGG
did commit an offense or offenses in this County on the 23 day of SEPTEMBER, 2013

previous to the issuance of this Warrant, by unlawfully *[State statutory language of offense(s)]*

§61-2-1. First and second degree murder defined; allegations in indictment for homicide.

Murder by poison, lying in wait, imprisonment, starving, or by any willful, deliberate and premeditated killing, or in the commission of, or attempt to commit, arson, kidnapping, sexual assault, robbery, burglary, breaking and entering, escape from lawful custody, or a felony offense of manufacturing or delivering a controlled substance as defined in article four, chapter sixty-a of this code, is murder of the first degree. All other murder is murder of the second degree 61-2-14a. Kidnaping; penalty.

(a) Any person who unlawfully restrains another person with the intent:

(1) To hold another person for ransom, reward, or concession;

(2) To transport another person with the intent to inflict bodily injury or to terrorize the victim or another person; or

(3) To use another person as a shield or hostage, shall be guilty of a felony and, upon conviction, shall be punished by confinement by the division of corrections for life, and, notwithstanding the provisions of article twelve, chapter sixty-two of this code, shall not be eligible for parole.

(b) The following exceptions shall apply to the penalty contained in subsection (a):

(1) A jury may, in their discretion, recommend mercy, and if such recommendation is added to their verdict, such person shall be eligible for parole in accordance with the provisions of said article twelve;

(2) if such person pleads guilty, the court may, in its discretion, provide that such person shall be eligible for parole in accordance with the provisions of said article twelve, and, if the court so provides, such person shall be eligible for parole in accordance with the provisions of said article twelve in the same manner and with like effect as if such person had been found guilty by the verdict of a jury and the jury had recommended mercy;
against the peace and dignity of the State.

NARRATIVE:

On October 2, 2013, KANAWHA County Sheriff's Office Detectives interviewed Matthew Legg. Mr. Legg stated that on September 23, 2013, his sister, Kelsey Legg, told him that she lured Kareem Hunter to her apartment located at 207 1/2 83rd Street, Marmet, Kanawha County, WV. The purpose of luring Kareem to her apartment was so that a male could place a bag over Kareem's head and take him out of her apartment.

While interviewing Matt Legg, detectives learned that he heard the altercation occurring inside Kelsey Legg's apartment. He later observed 2 males remove the body from the apartment and place the body in the trunk of a vehicle. He stated the body was that of Kareem Hunter and that Kareem Hunter was dead.

A search of Kelsey Legg's apartment, located at 207 1/2 Apartment #4 83rd Street, Marmet, Kanawha County, West Virginia, revealed evidence of a violent crime. Large suspected bloodstains were indicated at various locations inside of the apartment. Additionally, suspected blood spatter stains were observed on the ceiling inside of the apartment. Statements of witnesses indicated that the apartment was cleaned, walls were painted, and carpet was replaced after the time of the disturbance on September 23, 2013.

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
